

From The President's Desk

In a recent Family Circus, the kids have put a play house on the green pool table and the little boy says "I put in an artificial lawn to save water". That

cartoon got me thinking about lawn watering and saving water. We have been blessed this summer so far with some good rains.

The Neighborhood Alliance recently sent me an article "Water Saving Tips." I thought I would share them with you to help keep your yard and garden in tip top shape – and don't forget to water your trees.

- 1. If you have a company doing your yard, ask if they have a "Landscape Water Budget" which would help you develop a water management plan.
- 2. Install a smart irrigation controller. A smart controller automatically makes adjustments based on weather changes (how cool is that?)
- 3. Water during early morning hours. Wind speed and evaporation are at their lowest.
- 4. Control High Water Pressure. Excessive misting is a classic symptom of high water pressure. Mist blows away and does not reach the lawn. Install pop-up spays with build in pressure regulation.
- 5. Fix leaks and adjust sprinkler heads. Cracked and broken heads have potential to waste thousands of gallons of water.
- 6. Eliminate Fescue in the landscape. It needs two times the amount of water Bermuda grass does. Use zoysia grass or money grass.
- 7. Use cycle and soak to limit water runoff. Split water times into two or three short cycles. This allows water to soak in and not run off. 8. For more information go to http://www.squeezeeverydrop.com.

BEAUTIFICATION REPORT

I'm elated and very thankful to report two sets of new garden volunteers:

- Becky Fetters will assist long-time gardener, Dianne Kennedy, with both Overland Street gardens on Bryant on both Hartsdel and Del City's western border.
- Travis and Crissy will begin caring for the 44th St and Leonhardt west garden.

These two families are already busy people and to show they do care about their neighborhood they want to help where they can.

Caring for four gardens isn't supposed to be my responsibility, but that's what happens without enough gardeners. I am blessed to have a friend who doesn't even live in Del City, but she wants to help. After her first weeding experience she discovered she enjoys the exercise. Check with your friends and see if you can help us in some way, temporarily or permanently. None of us knows how long we will have to be active.

Bob McCracken, beautification cochair, with pick-up transportation provided by Larry, made two trips to Home Depot for sixty-two big bags of Cypress mulch for the gardens. Delivery was made to each gardener's house for their convenience in applying. Soon as we get it covering the weed and grass free ground the results will manifest in fewer weeds and grass intrusion and moisture conservation for the plants. The forked in old mulch will add to the fertilizer by enriching the soil each year.

Del City public works employees are again letting the mowers deposit debris in our neighborhood flower gardens. Their supervisor, David Ellis, will inform and request they turn the mower away from the gardens. This will greatly assist us gardeners by diminishing those weed and grass seeds from germinating in our garden, consequently eliminating extra weeding. Because of the huge turnover of employees the reminder has to be given a few times during the growing season.

Speaking of weeding, timing is everything. A collinear hoe has been suggested as an essential weeding tool. Its thin blade skims just below the soil surface, removing weeds with the roots while they are still small. When the weed is mature more effort is required to remove the stable, deeply planted root. Even though this is considered a chore, it can result in relaxation due to meditative thoughts. Listen to the birds and mull things over. Accept your accomplishment of freeing chosen plants from competition and looking at a tidied-up bed.

Proverbs 21:31 quoted loosely to imply "We can get the soil enriched and weed free but it is the Lord who gives the colorful aesthetic results".

Eight of our 15 Hartsdel gardens were represented by six members at our May monthly meeting. There is still an opening for a gardener at 44th St and Leonhardt, east side. If you would, please, just go look at the garden and find the water access a few feet east, then consider keeping it

weed free by visiting it weekly or biweekly for 30 minutes. Call Della with you decision. A former gardener transplanted yellow canas and pink four o'clock flowers which fill the area and present an inviting entrance into Hartsdel off 44th St and onto Leonhardt St. Sometimes instead of weeds you'll find overgrown four o'clocks which need to be trimmed back so the mowers can get to the curb on the garden's south side. It's optional if you want to keep them trimmed so the 'Hartsdel' white letters are exposed or covered.

To eliminate unwanted debris in your yard, specifically the 'free papers' thrown weekly by the Oklahoman Publishing Co. It has the Buyer's EDGE advertisement, and sometimes other papers. They tell me we don't subscribe to it, BUT if we want to stop it, each household needs to call 478-7171 to stop it. I can't call in for the neighborhood which I would like to. Ideally each resident would join the 'pick up and pitch in' crew before it becomes debris. If I could campaign that would be my soap box \square . renters Prospective or buvers perusing a neighborhood notice how clean, neat, and cared for it is, evidenced by the appearance on any given day. We want to attract newcomers who care so they will be an asset not a detriment to our Hartsdel Neighborhood.



KITCHEN TIME

Coffee and Brown Sugar-Crusted Skirt Steak

Servings: 8

Prep time: 15mins; Total time: 20mins

This recipe_is from CountryLiving.com, July 2015. This spice mix is a great go-to rub for the grill.

Ingredients

¹/₄ c. finely ground espresso coffee (not instant)

1/4 c. dark brown sugar, firmly packed

1-1/2 tsp. Kosher salt

¹/₈ tsp. each of ground cinnamon, ground ginger, ground white pepper, & five-spice powder

Pinch cayenne pepper

2-1/2 lb. skirt steak, cut into 4 pieces

1 tbsp. olive oil

Directions:

- 1. Heat grill to high.
- 2. Combine coffee, brown sugar, salt, cinnamon, ginger, white pepper, five-spice powder, and cayenne pepper in a bowl.
- 3. Remove steak from frig & let come to room temp for ~15 minutes. Rub steak with oil, and sprinkle with rub. Massage rub into meat.
- 4. Grill until charred and medium-rare, 2 to 4 minutes per side. Transfer to a cutting board, cover with foil and let rest 5 minutes before thinly slicing at an angle. Serve immediately.
